

Script for the UK End of the Day 22.15 hrs Meeting (20/03/2020)

(Note: Trusted Servant should arrive about 5 minutes before the start of the call and take the names of callers as they check in.)

Welcome to the **UK End of the Day 22.15 hrs Meeting**. This meeting is open to anyone who desires to stop their compulsive sexual behaviors, there are no other requirements. We take turns answering a list of three questions which are available on our webpage via <http://saatalk.info/en/meetings> Our experience is that it is possible to be brief and still share in a way that is honest and meaningful and to commit to what it takes to stay sober just for today.

We respectfully ask that all participants refrain from using either profanity or explicit sexual descriptions. Because background noise can be so disruptive to the call, we also ask that participants please remember to mute your phones when you're not speaking. If your phone does not have the mute feature, you may *6 to mute and *6 to unmute. Finally, if at possible, as a courtesy to others and to keep the meeting flowing, we asks participants to please write down the names of the person who comes before and after you in the lineup. So far we have, on the call...*(Trusted servant lists all in order, starting with self.)*

Let's start the meeting with a moment of silence, for those who still suffer inside and out of the rooms, followed by the Serenity Prayer. The trusted servant will say the prayer aloud and others may say it silently to themselves. First, a moment of silence.

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

Has anyone else joined our call for question #1? Please feel free to introduce yourself if you wish – you are very welcome. *(Trusted servant takes names of any joining the call.)* I'll now read the order of the participants. I am X in Y and I'll pass to A in B who will pass to C in D, and so on.

Question 1: Do you admit you are powerless over sexual addiction and with your Higher Power's help, are you willing to seek sobriety and recovery today? *(Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.)*

Has anyone else joined us for question 1? Please feel free to introduce yourself if you wish – you are very welcome. *(Have the new arrivals answer the question.)* The bottom of the order will be G in H passing to J in K, and so on. *(Trusted servant also notes any changes in the lineup for folks who have said they are leaving the call.)*

We will now move on to Question 2. A reminder, there is a one-minute time limit for question two. At the end of a minute, I will quietly and gently say "Time" and please wrap up your share at that point.

Question 2: Is there anything in the past 24 hours or anything in the upcoming 24 hours that endangers your sobriety, and what solutions can you use to overcome temptations or handle life today? *(Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.)*

Has anyone else joined us for question 2? Please feel free to introduce yourself if you wish – you are very welcome. (*Have the new arrivals answer the question.*) The bottom of the order will be G in H passing to J in K, and so on. (*Trusted servant notes any changes in the lineup for folks who have said they are leaving the call.*)

Now Question 3: Name three things you are grateful for and are you willing to turn your will and your life over to God, as you understand God? (*Trusted servant answers the question and passes, etc.*)

Has anyone else joined us for question 3? Please feel free to introduce yourself if you wish – you are very welcome. (*Have the new arrivals answer the question.*)

Now is time for announcements.

A reminder on the 7th Tradition. The Seventh Tradition states that "every group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions." 12-step meetings around the world pass a basket to receive donations that are used to support recovery. Because that activity is not possible in our telemeeting, we would encourage you to consider making a donation to the UK Intergroup at saauk.info/donate or the Telemeeting Intergroup at saatalk.org or ISO Intergroup at saa-store.org/7thTradition Those web addresses are listed in the meeting script which can be downloaded from our webpage. Your donation will help all of us in our recovery.

We welcome any newcomers to the call and suggest that in addition to this call you attend a traditional face-to-face or telemeeting to determine if the program is right for you.

After the meeting, the parking lot will be open for anyone who has a question about the program or just wants to continue fellowship. To enter the parking lot all you have to do is stay on the line. The parking lot will remain open as long as there are two callers on the line. If you hear music, it means you are the last caller and the parking lot is closed.

Are there any other announcements for the good of the fellowship?
(*After announcements are complete*)

Let's end the meeting with a moment of silence, for those who still suffer inside and out of the rooms, followed by the third step prayer. The trusted servant will say the prayer aloud and others may say it silently to themselves. First, a moment of silence.

God, I offer myself to thee, to build with me and to do with me as thou wilt. Relieve me of the bondage of self that I may better do thy will. Take away my difficulties as victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of thy power, thy love and thy way of life. May I do thy will always. Amen.
